Warren Phipps is an Acting Assistant Professor at the University of Washington and Associate in the Vaccine and Infectious Disease Division at the Fred Hutchinson Cancer Research Center. Over the last 5 years, he has served as the Medical Director the Uganda Cancer Institute/Hutchinson Center Cancer Alliance (UCI/HCCA) in Kampala, Uganda. He also serves as the Director of Faculty Development for UCI/HCCA and oversees a novel peer mentoring program for early-career investigators in Uganda.

Dr. Phipps conducts research on infection-related cancers in sub-Saharan Africa. His research focuses on human herpesvirus-8 (HHV-8) virology and the pathogenesis of Kaposi sarcoma (KS), the most common HIV-associated malignancy worldwide. Specific areas of investigation include identifying factors associated with KS presentation and treatment outcomes, as well as characterizing host and viral gene expression in KS tumors.

Dr. Phipps earned his bachelor's degree from Yale University and MD from Harvard Medical School. He completed his residency in internal medicine at the University of California San Francisco and an infectious diseases fellowship at the University of Washington, where he also received an MPH degree.
