- Most wanted to learn about self-advocacy
- Many wanted to "pay it forward" by advocating for others

Primacy of Relationships


- Mutual Trust and Trustworthiness

Without Judgment


 Impact of real or perceived judgments of biases about race, sexuality, and personal qualities, individual choices















Building Self- Trust

- Self-esteem—global sense of selfworthiness
- Self-efficacy—confidence in ability to perform specific behavior/s in a context
- Self-trust—both the one trusted and the one extending trust
