

Community Action Coalition (CAC)



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What is the CAC?

The Community Action Coalition (CAC) is a group of individuals representing community-based organizations working together to improve cancer health outcomes for residents of Western Washington. CAC is facilitated by the Fred Hutch/University of Washington/Seattle Children's Cancer Consortium's (Consortium) Office of Community Outreach and Engagement (OCOE), based in Seattle.

CAC members provide insight from their lived experiences and organizational roles to facilitate understanding of community-specific cancer prevention and control needs. As a group, the CAC highlights community feedback and priorities, shares resources, collaborates on projects to support sustainable health and cancer care programs and builds capacity for community-driven research collaborations.

In 2024, the CAC met four times, welcoming eight presenters from community-based organizations and health organizations across the state.



Meet the OCOE Team

The Office of Community Outreach and Engagement (OCOE) works to improve health outcomes through authentic relationships, advocacy and collaboration. This includes facilitating community-based research, resource support and cancer prevention education informed by community-determined needs. The OCOE team works to build community partnerships across Washington state with offices in Spokane, Sunnyside and Seattle.

We understand that communities know what they need and have the knowledge and expertise to implement solutions to address health disparities. Through the work of community health educators and support staff, OCOE brings organizations together to talk about cancer prevention and improved health outcome strategies in western Washington.

The CAC works alongside two other OCOE-facilitated coalitions, one in Central Washington (Sunnyside, started in 1995) and one in Eastern Washington (Spokane, started in 2022). When we come together, we find collaborative solutions and renewed energy to address the most important health issues facing our communities.





Approach & Priorities

We are a group committed to collaboration, sharing resources and listening to and prioritizing community voices.

We give feedback to Fred Hutch and the Consortium to help set priorities and strategies to ensure community needs are addressed.

We connect coalition members and Consortium researchers to promote mutually beneficial cancer research with the communities we serve.

We partner to support and establish programs that address the burden of cancer in Washington state.

We share resources and ideas within the CAC to support our mutual work in health care access and cancer prevention.


